## MB2-712 Sample Questions:

**01. You have an entity that has two activated business process flows named BPF1 and BPF2. A user starts a process by using BPF1, but then discovers that BPF2 must be used. What should you tell the user?**

- b) Ownership of the records created in BPF1 will be assigned to the system when you switch to BPF2.

**02. In a Dynamics CRM organization, you create a custom entity named Location. You need to create a hierarchal set of location records. What should you do?**

- b) Create a many-to-many (N:N) relationship between the same entity and set Hierarchical to Yes for the relationship definition.
